

CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS: “Difficult Histories”

For a Special Issue of *The Middle Ground Journal: World History and Global Studies*

Deadline for submissions: December 15, 2022

The Middle Ground Journal invites submissions of articles for a special issue of the journal on “Difficult Histories,” the theme for the joint conference of the Midwest World History Association (<https://mwwha.org>) and the Great Lakes History Conference, which is to be held September 23-24, 2022, both in-person and virtually. The perspective that world history can provide on contemporary events is vital, and this theme is intended to invite presentations and discussions to the conference on how teaching and research in the field can offer perspective on the challenges of our own times. The journal will give extra consideration to articles submitted as papers to the conference. The deadline to submit proposals to the conference is May 15, 2022, and the deadline to submit articles for the journal’s special issue is December 15, 2022.
